'It's the island's steady climate, privacy and unique, unspoilt lifestyle that have, over the years, attracted discerning international owners and visitors,' explains Knight Frank's Edward de Mallet Morgan.

'Mustique encompasses only 1,400 acres and is characterised by rolling hills, lush terrain and stretches of deserted white-sand beaches surrounded by protected reefs and clear aquamarine seas. Its luxury is unrivalled and the market is robust. There's been a record number of sales in the past few years, with some of the biggest houses changing hands strong and enquiries about the Mustique and a rise in the number of rental enquiries.

### Colombo heights

C APPHIRE Residences (www.sapphire O residences.lk), the latest addition to the Sri Lankan capital, has just launched-and it'll be hard to miss (below). Set to be completed in 2021, there will be two massive towers with a 'futuristic illuminated exterior' -a 735ft residential one, alongside a 460fttall hotel-connected by a 177ft-long 'sky bridge' that incorporates an outdoor pool

A thoughtful triangular floorplan will maximise views across the Indian Ocean from each of the 132 über-luxury residences and buyers can choose from four interior styles, by London-based YOO with Philippe Starck, which draw inspiration from the local vernacular.

There will be several further swimming pools, a cinema, residents' lounge and library, an outdoor amphitheatre, spa, fitness centre, squash court and lawn play area. With prices from \$1.4 million (\$1.08 million), Sapphire Residences will launch onto the market later this month with Sotheby's International Realty (0753) 797385).



## **Quite Continental**

FTER a decade of poor results, things A are finally looking up for Europe. Four of the top 10 performing cities in Knight Frank's PIRI 100 Index (which analyses the performance of the world's prime secondhome and city residential markets) were on the Continent. In Amsterdam (right), property prices rose by 15%, Frankfurt by 12.9%, Paris by 12% and Madrid by 10.6%.

This growth in the luxury-property market has meant that some 15% more international buyers are using private jets to find and buy overseas property, according to global aviation company Air Partner (www. airpartner.com), Indeed, Knight Frank figures for 2017 show positive or stable annual price growth in two-thirds of 100 luxury residential markets.
